| Fabric | Fabric is cloth or other material produced by weaving together cotton, nylon, wool, silk, or other threads. Fabrics are used for making things like clothes, curtains, and sheets. | |
| Texture | The way that something feels when you touch it, for example how smooth or rough it is. | |
| Attach | Join or fasten something to an object. | |
| Scrap | A small piece of something that is no longer needed for its original purpose. | |
| Mixed media | Artwork that uses more than one materials. | |
| Collage | A picture that has been made by sticking pieces of coloured paper, cloth and other scrap materials onto paper. | |
| Appliqué | A decoration made of one material attached by sewing or gluing to another material. | |
| Layers | A piece of a material that covers a surface or that is between two other things. | |
| Combine | Join two or more things to make them one. | |
| Weave | Make a material by crossing threads over and under each other using a frame or machine called a loom. | |

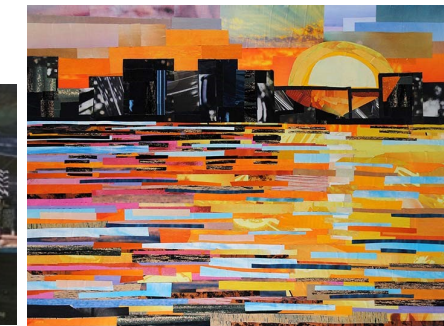

| <p>Colour</p> | <p>Primary colours = red, blue and yellow They are colours that cannot be made from mixing other colours together. Warm colours = red, orange, and yellow. Cool colours = purple, blue and green.</p> <p>Words to describe colour: Bold Vivid Dull Warm Cool</p> <p>Secondary colours, which are green, purple and orange, are made by mixing primary colours. Blue + yellow = green Blue + red = purple Red + yellow = orange</p> |
| <p>Shape</p> | <p>Geometric shapes</p> <p>circle square rectangle triangle</p> |
| <p>Texture</p> | <p>'Tactile' texture means you can actually touch it. 'Visual' texture is imagining what the texture might be in picture.</p> <p>Words to describe texture: .Rough .Smooth .Coarse .Fine .Uneven</p> |
