Mr Hardy's favourite bible verse is:



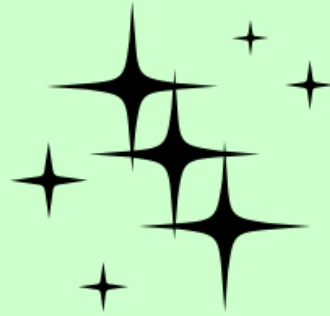
**'Let all that you do be done in love'

Mrs Atherton's favourite bible verse is:



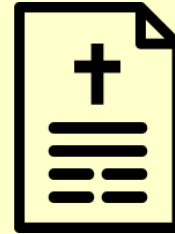
'Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.' Ephesians 4:32
